Coalitions

Since 2007, the Smithtown Youth Bureau and Horizons Counseling and Education Center have led a town-wide coalition to reduce substance abuse and increase wellness.

Together with the local school districts, places of worship, businesses, parents, government officials, and other concerned community members, the Youth and Community Alliance of Smithtown has met monthly to plan and promote activities to make the town a safer place for all its residents.
